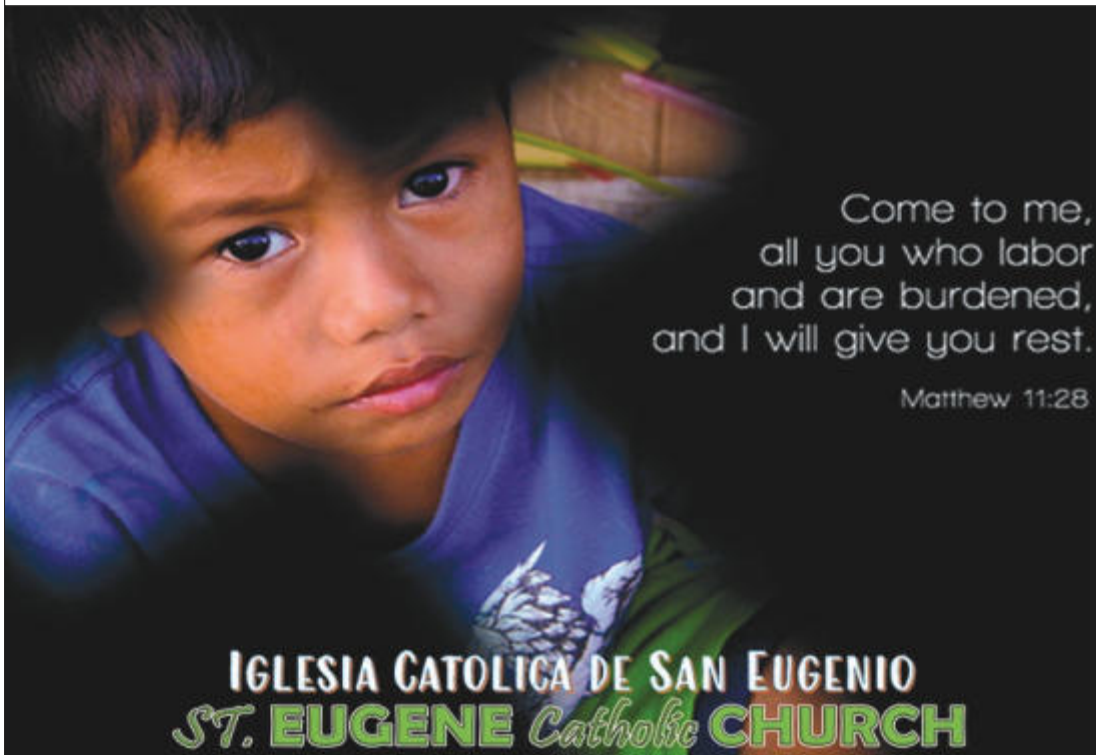

Fe como un Niño

Si buscas en Google las recomendaciones sobre cómo criar hijos generosos, casi todas las listas de ideas comienzan con, o al menos contienen, la directiva para que los adultos sean buenos modelos de generosidad. Nuestros niños aprenden de nuestras acciones mucho más que de nuestras palabras. Por supuesto, cuando pienso en los años mientras mis hijos crecían, creo que aprendí tanto de ellos como ellos aprendieron de mí. Hay un tiempo entre la infancia temprana y la escuela secundaria en el que un niño parece ser más libre para dar y compartir que en cualquier otro momento de la vida. Es alrededor de la edad de la Primera Comunión cuando los gritos de "mío" se convierten en risas y sonrisas, y la necesidad de ser parte de algo más grande que uno mismo lleva a compartir. Antes de que te des cuenta, el niño llega a los años de la preadolescencia y, una vez más, se convierte en el centro del universo.

(Zechariah 9:9-10; Romans 8:9, 11-13; Matthew 11:25-30)

Faith Like a Child

If you Google Search recommendations on how to raise generous children, almost every list of ideas begins with — or at least contains — the directive for adults to be good models of generosity themselves. Our children learn from our actions much more than from our words. Of course, when I think back over the years while my children were growing up, I think I may have learned as much from them as they learned from me. There is a time between early childhood and middle school where a child seems to be freer to give and share than at any other time in life. It is around the age of First Communion when the cries of “mine” turn to laughter and smiles, and the urge to be a part of something bigger than oneself leads to sharing. Before you know it, the child hits the pre-teen years, and once again, he or she becomes the center of the universe.

I believe that the previous paragraph is all true, however, the stages described seem to repeat themselves throughout adulthood. Don't you agree? Sometimes we fall into seeing ourselves as the center of the universe, or we become consumed by our state in life or with what we have acquired. Also, we at times are generous and loving people. It is sin that draws us back into ourselves and away from any meaningful life of stewardship and generosity. In order to be freed for love, we need role models to help us see what really matters. We need to reflect on the example of many of our brothers and sisters in Christ. And, yes, we need to look to children who may be at the point in their lives where sharing is fun, and love is something in abundance. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

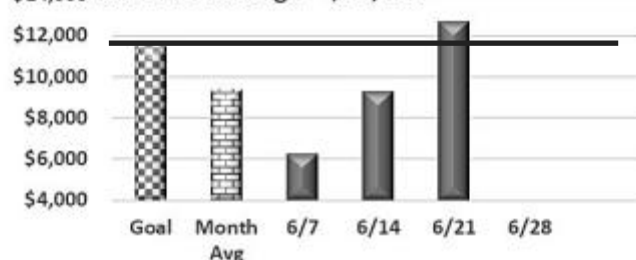
Please remember Saint Eugene in your Last Will and Testament

## Inviting Parishioners to Spend an Hour Before the Blessed Sacrament

Our Parish is calling for Adorers to answer the Lord's call to spend a holy hour of adoration once a week (every Thursday) in our chapel from 9:30 AM until 9:00 PM. We welcome new adorers as our Lord awaits for each and every one of us to come and stay with Him.

Dear Parishioners,

We are excited to welcome back our family! As we prepare to gradually welcome back our community in Phase 2 of our reopening, I ask for your patience and understanding as we adapt to a new “normal”. Your health and safety is our top priority. In the meantime, please take note of the following protocols:

**SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION** ~ The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days **remains suspended** in the Diocese of Raleigh during the COVID-19 pandemic. We encourage those who are most vulnerable and at risk to **STAY HOME**. We will continue to live stream our Masses in the best way we can.

Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with health directives. **Please DO NOT come to Mass.**

**Everyone coming to Mass will be subject to a temperature screen before entering the church.**

**CHURCH CAPACITY** ~ For the time-being, we will be only filling the Church to a maximum of **25% capacity**, observing proper social distancing of 6 feet apart and **every other pew; for us, this translates to no more than 110 individuals per mass -but fewer might only be possible based on social distance seating**. If we reach the allowed capacity at any Mass, please be understanding if the usher informs you that we cannot take any more into the church.

**You may watch on Facebook the live streaming of Masses (only on Sunday 10 AM in English & 12 PM in Spanish) from your smartphones outside the church (there is no accessible Wifi).**

An outside audio will be broadcast outside the church for those who are not comfortable to enter the church building (available only on weekend masses).

**DONATIONS** ~ We are accepting donations such as **disinfectant wipes, Lysol, Ethyl alcohol (75% or higher), hand sanitizer, masks, etc.** All donations should be new and in original packaging. Please bring them to the church on weekend masses. Thank you!

#### **WHAT WILL THIS REOPENING LOOK LIKE...?**

**Masks** ~ Face coverings/masks **are required while inside the church building.**

**Safe Space: Social Distancing** ~ Everyone coming to Mass must enter through the front doors (principal doors) and exit in the side doors. Exit must be done per pew to observe social distancing. (*Back section first*)

#### **PLEASE FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS OF THE USHERS!!**

Families living in the same house may sit together in the same pew and are not required to social distance.

**Holy Communion** ~ **Holy Communion will be received in the hand ONLY.** When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: *‘When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, take care that nothing is lost.’*

Holy Communion will be brought to the faithful both inside the church and those attending outside. **PLEASE DO NOT MOVE FROM YOUR SEAT.**

**Offertory** ~ Stationary collection baskets are placed near the baptismal font. If you are bringing your offering with you, place it in the baskets before or after Mass. Individuals are encouraged to donate online if possible.

**Music/Hymnals** ~ Due to concerns that congregational singing requires increased volumes of projected air and particulates, please refrain from singing at Masses for the time being. Please use these times for continued meditation and prayer.

Only a cantor and an instrumentalist will be utilized for limited liturgical singing at the present time.

Hymnals and other liturgical aids will not be available.

**Sanitizing the Church** ~ We respectfully ask you to exit the church as soon as Mass has concluded to allow for the church to be disinfected before the next Mass.

**Restrooms will be available ONLY for emergencies.**

Socializing may take place in the parking lot after Mass, but please remember to maintain social distancing guidelines.

Estimados parroquianos:

¡Estamos emocionados de dar la bienvenida a nuestra familia! Mientras nos preparamos para recibir gradualmente a nuestra comunidad en la Fase 2 de nuestra reapertura, les pido su paciencia y comprensión mientras nos adaptamos a una nueva "normalidad". Su salud y seguridad es nuestra principal prioridad. Mientras tanto, debe tenerse en cuenta lo siguiente:

**OBLIGACIÓN DE LA MISA DOMINICAL** ~ La obligación de asistir a misa los domingos y días festivos **permanece suspendida** en la Diócesis de Raleigh durante la pandemia de COVID-19. Alentamos a las personas más vulnerables y en riesgo a **QUEDARSE EN CASA**. Continuaremos transmitir en vivo las Misas de la mejor manera posible.

Las personas sintomáticas o que hayan estado expuestas a otra persona con el virus dentro de los 14 días no pueden ingresar a la iglesia, de acuerdo con las directivas de salud. **Por favor NO venga a Misa.**

Los fieles que van a asistir la Misa deberán pasar un examen de temperatura antes de entrar en la iglesia.

**CAPACIDAD DE LA IGLESIA** ~ Por el momento, solo se permitirá un máximo **del 25% de la capacidad** de la iglesia, observando un distanciamiento social de 6 pies de distancia y se usará una banca si y otra no; para nosotros, esto se traduce **no más de 110 personas o podría ser menos** debido a la distancia social por cada Misa. Si alcanzamos la capacidad permitida en cualquier Misa, comprenda si el ujier le informa que no podemos dejar entrar más personas a la iglesia.

**Puede ver en Facebook la transmisión en vivo las Misas (solo el domingo 10 AM en Inglés y 12 PM en Español) desde tus smartphones fuera de la iglesia (WiFi no esta disponible).**

Altavoces están disponibles afuera para transmitir el audio de la Misa por aquellos que no están cómodos de entrar en el edificio de la iglesia. (*disponible sólo en las misas de fin de semana*)

**DONACIONES** ~ Estamos aceptando donaciones como **toallitas desinfectantes, Lysol, alcohol etílico (75% o más), desinfectantes para manos, mascarillas**, etc. Todas las donaciones deberían ser nuevas y en el embalaje original. Por favor tráigalos a la iglesia el domingo en una de las misas. ¡Gracias!

**¿CÓMO SERÁ ESTA REAPERTURA...?**

**Mascarilla** ~ Mascarillas faciales **se requieren** mientras dentro del edificio de la iglesia.

**Espacio seguro: Distanciamiento Social** ~ Todos los que llegan a Misa deben entrar a través de las puertas del frente (*puertas principales*) y salir por las puertas laterales. La salida debe hacerse por cada banca para observar el distanciamiento social. (*sección posterior primera*)

**POR FAVOR, SIGA LAS INSTRUCCIONES DE LOS UJIERES!!**

Las familias que viven en la misma casa pueden sentarse juntas en la misma banca y no se requiere a la distancia social.

**Sagrada Comunión** ~ La Sagrada Comunión se recibirá **SOLO en la mano**. Al recibir en la mano, el comulgante debe guiarse por las palabras de San Cirilo de Jerusalén: '*Cuando se acerque, tenga cuidado de no hacerlo con la mano extendida y los dedos abiertos o separados, sino que coloque la mano izquierda como un trono debajo de tu derecha, como corresponde a quien está a punto de recibir al Rey. Entonces recíbalo, tenga cuidado de que no se pierda nada.*'

La Sagrada Comunión será llevada a los fieles tanto dentro de la iglesia como a los que asisten fuera. **POR FAVOR NO SE MUEVE DE SU LUGAR.**
